

provide effective, evidence-based interventions for tobacco dependence for all forms of tobacco and nicotine use. TTSs are trained to develop individualized

Target Audience: Advanced practice providers, health educators, mental health counselors, nurses, pharmacists, physicians, respiratory therapists, social workers, and other health care professionals who treat tobacco and nicotine users.

Training Prerequisite: Prior to attending the TTS training, all candidates must successfully complete the Basic Skills for Working with Smokers online course.
